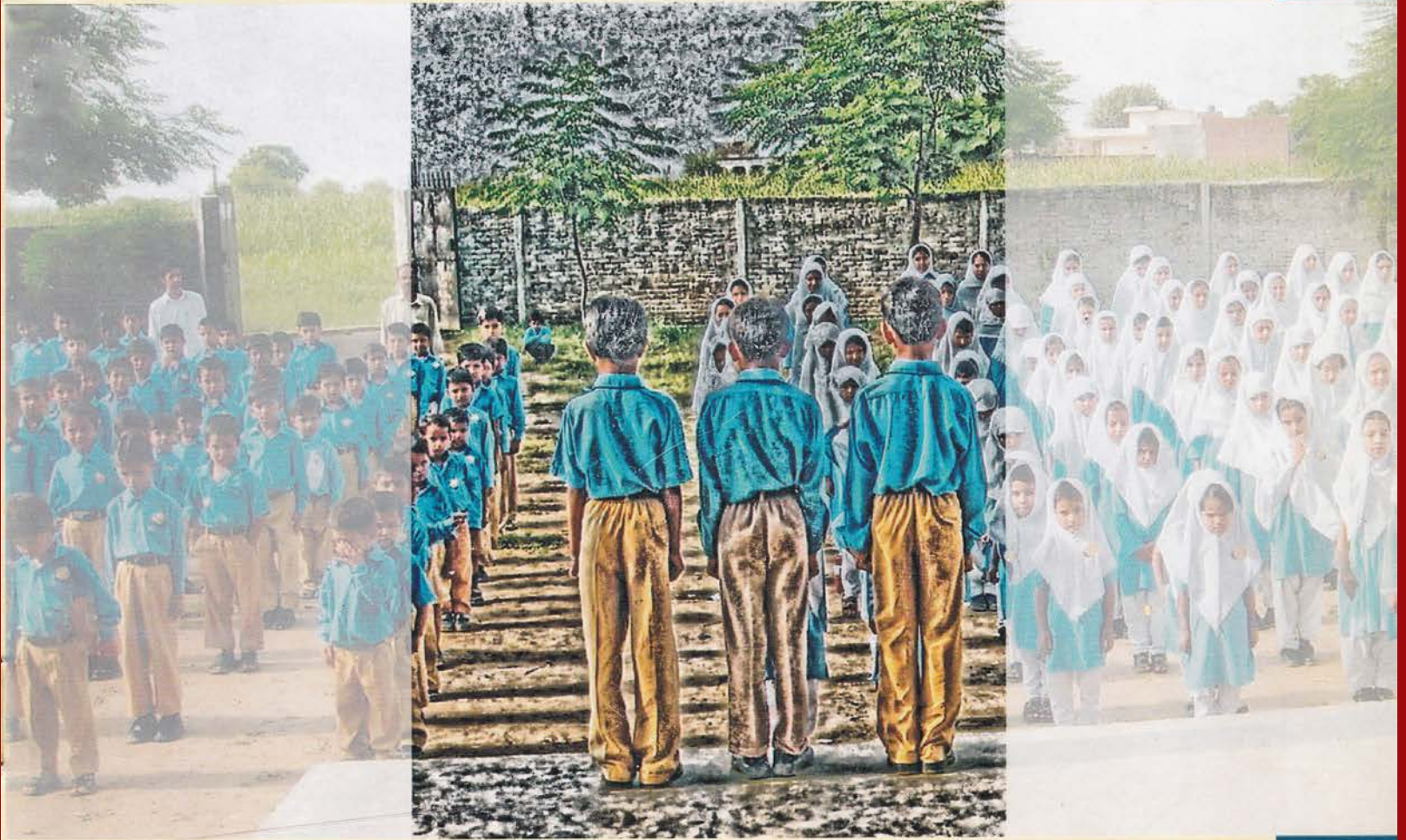

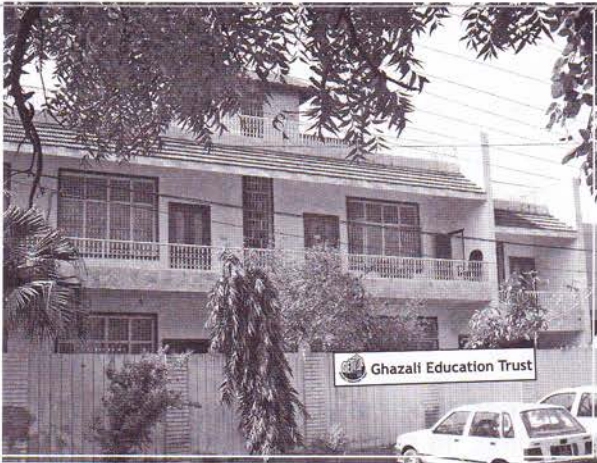

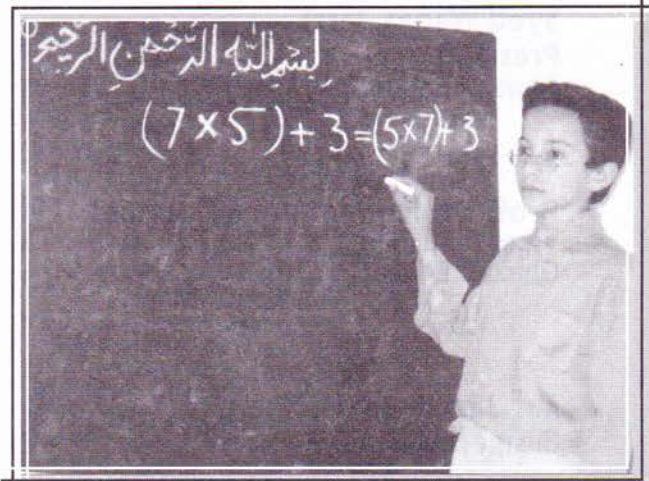

Pakistan Rural Education Program (PREP) is working as a faculty of Ghazali Education Trust (GET). PREP is the herald of Educational Revolution in Pakistan and its students are vanguard of the educational forces advancing towards the goal of "Better Society Through Value Based Education". Pakistan Rural Education Program is the evidence to the fact that missionary passions and sincere efforts can make the dreams come true. PREP was established in 1997 with a sincere aspiration to elevate the educational standards in Pakistan especially in remote, deprived and under developed rural areas.

PREP began its work with meagre resources, but with profound trust in the help of Allah Almighty, it has flourished in a short span of nine years. Currently, there are 267 schools working in 28 districts of Pakistan with 1400 devoted teachers and having more than 30,000 students in these schools. PREP is focusing on quality education adopting modern and progressive ways while keeping in view the Islamic values and ethics.

PREP is responsible for establishing high standard education centers in remote and rural areas. It has chosen the life of Imam Ghazali (450-505 AH) as a role model and named its learning centers as GET School System (GSS). It is a single-class, single teacher phenomenon which gradually turns into a full fledged primary or secondary school.

- To Involve and mobilize the community for eradication of illiteracy.

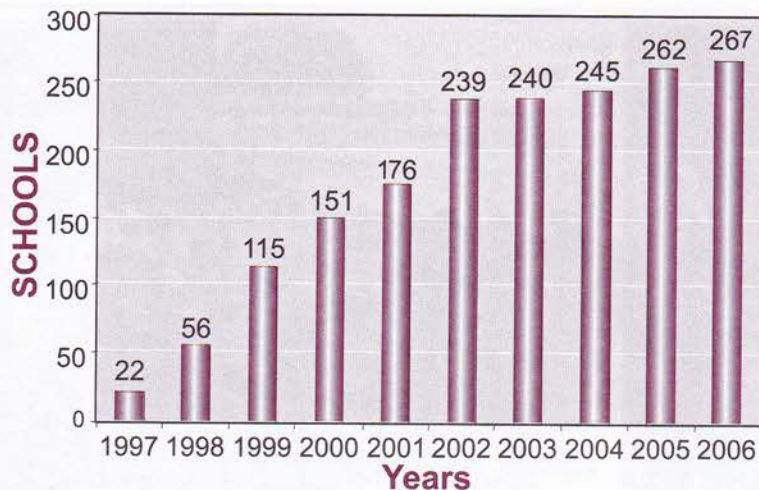
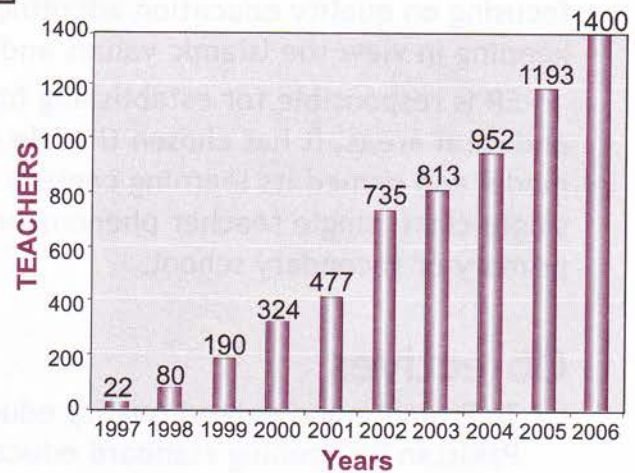
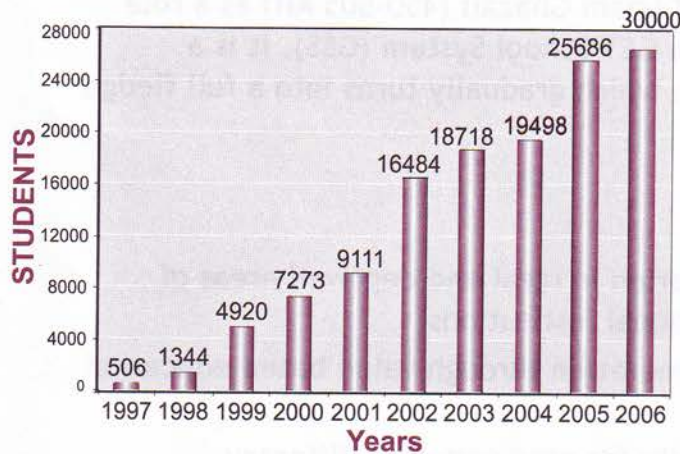

We are assuring of the best tools like model lesson plans, model papers, model tests etc, to be practiced at GET. The main purpose of R&D is to serve both the purposes i.e. Developing quality assurance tools and assessment of the impact in qualitative terms.

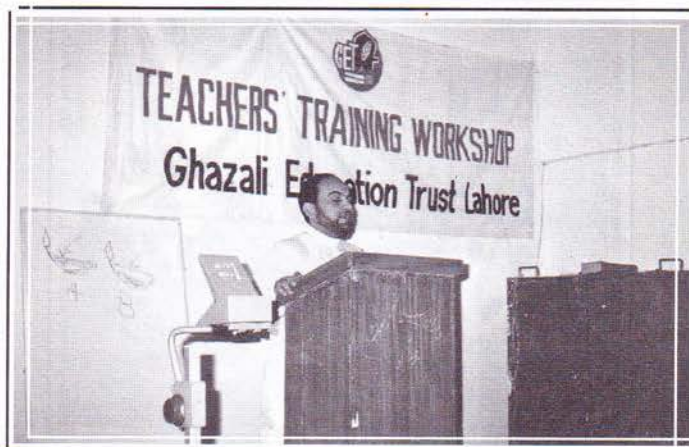


Human Resource Department (HRD)

Human Resource Department (HRD) believes that only competent teachers can ensure a sound educational system. To meet the primary objective of Trust, HRD designs Teachers Training Program that not only imparts good teaching skills among the teachers but also provides a continuous system of refresher courses.

The teachers' training activities start with teacher's Pre-Posting workshops and culminate by making them Master Trainers. During this process, a teacher has to go through a vast and intensive training program that includes a variety of courses, ranging from skill enhancements and subject specialization of educational management and Islamic knowledge (Fahm-e-Din). For quality purposes it has been ensured that every teacher needs to pass through at least four different refresher and professional courses throughout a year. Many renowned educationists and eminent university scholars are engaged in this activity.

A fully furnished residential Training Center in Lahore has already started its operations to facilitate and accommodate all the Trust's teaching staff. Moreover, HRD is accommodating private Schools as well.



Teacher's Training Centre

Ghazali Education Trust is striving to impart quality education in rural areas of Pakistan. Trained teaching staff is one of the most important pre-requisites of promoting quality education. Teachers' training has always been a point of focus in GET. Trust started its teachers' training program no sooner did it came into being in 1995. Ghazali Training Centre Lahore is another sign of our commitment with teachers' training.

GET has established a Teacher Training Centre at Ghazali Education Trust School Heir, 10 Km away from Defense Housing Society Lahore. The centre has a state of art classroom that can accommodate 40 teachers at a time, along with the dining and lodging facilities for the trainees.

The classroom is equipped with almost all the basic technicalities i.e multimedia, over head projectors and computers etc.

Being located in a school, the centre provides the participants with an opportunity to practice the learned skills in the actual classroom during the workshops. Not only the teachers of GET from all over Pakistan are being facilitated but the teachers of the local schools are also getting advantages & via these training programs held in the Ghazali Training Centre.

Future Plan:

In the nearer future, the Training Centre will be equipped with modern computer lab and a library. We are also planning to establish similar kind of teachers training centres in other parts of the country.



Land Acquisition & Construction Department (LACD)

Land Acquisition & Construction Department (LACD) provides a reasonable shelter and roof to the students getting admission in GET Schools so that they get their education in a pleasant environment. LACD has a target to complete five buildings every year.

LACD is responsible to plan, design, and construct buildings. Initially GET schools are opened in rented buildings, which cannot fulfill our requirements when two or three years pass away. Our dream school campus comprises of ideal size class rooms, spacious play ground and well-ventilated building.

Objectives

1. To design and execute construction plan where resources are offered for building.
2. To develop liaison with donors.
3. To get transfer of land on the name of GET.
4. To transfer donated pieces of land to the Trust.
5. To renovate already existing school buildings. Keep a record of under construction and constructed buildings at Head Office.
6. To develop a construction policy for the guidance of both the donors and the personnel managing of the constructed buildings.
