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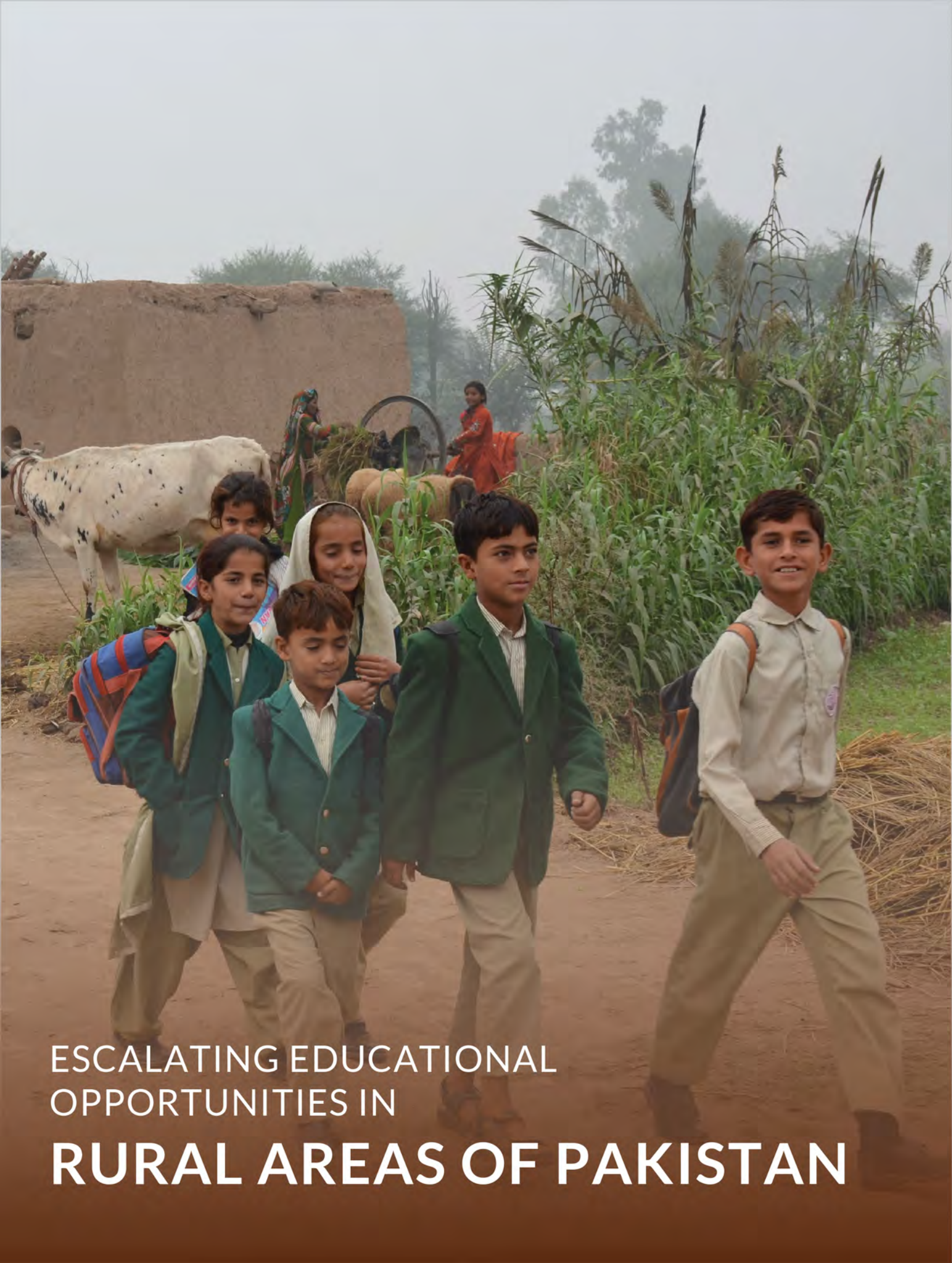

Ghazali Education Trust (GET) is a non-profit, non-governmental and non-political organization based in Lahore, Pakistan. Dream of a 100% literate Pakistan was the guiding force behind its establishment in 1995. Children who are deprived of education are the target for GET's initiatives. Since its inception, the organization is mainly active in the least privileged rural areas.

Initially, the organization had 22 schools in 3 districts with 256 students and 22 teachers. Currently, it has 650 schools, almost 100,000 students, 4000 teachers with an outreach in 36 districts across Pakistan. Moreover, it is also providing education to the minorities and special children. The organization is striving to expand its network further, and therefore needs your support.

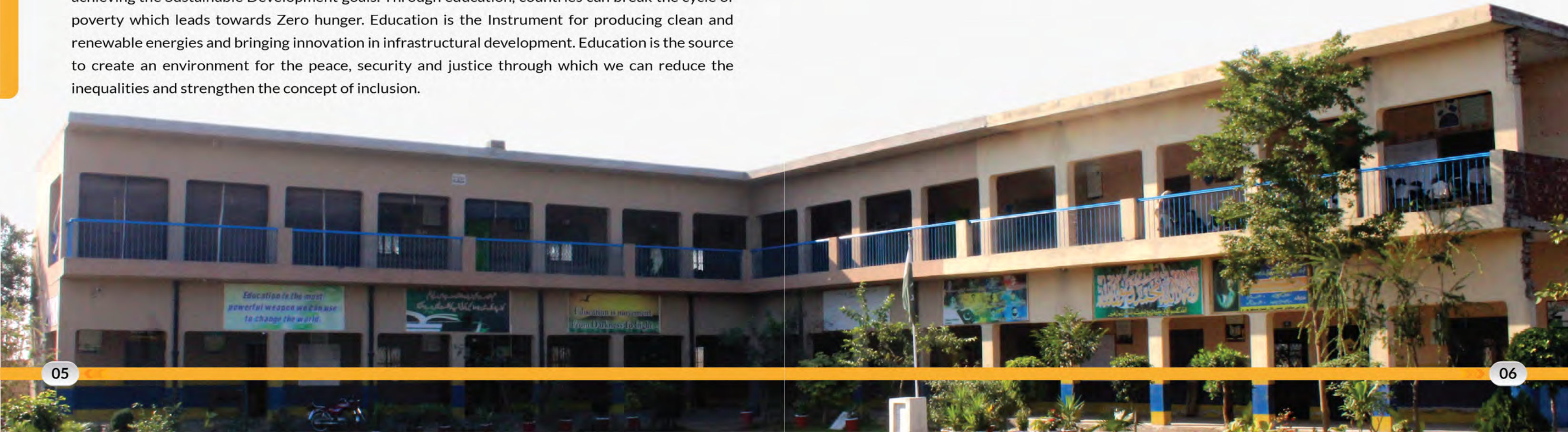


Areas of our interventions

Model of GET Schools



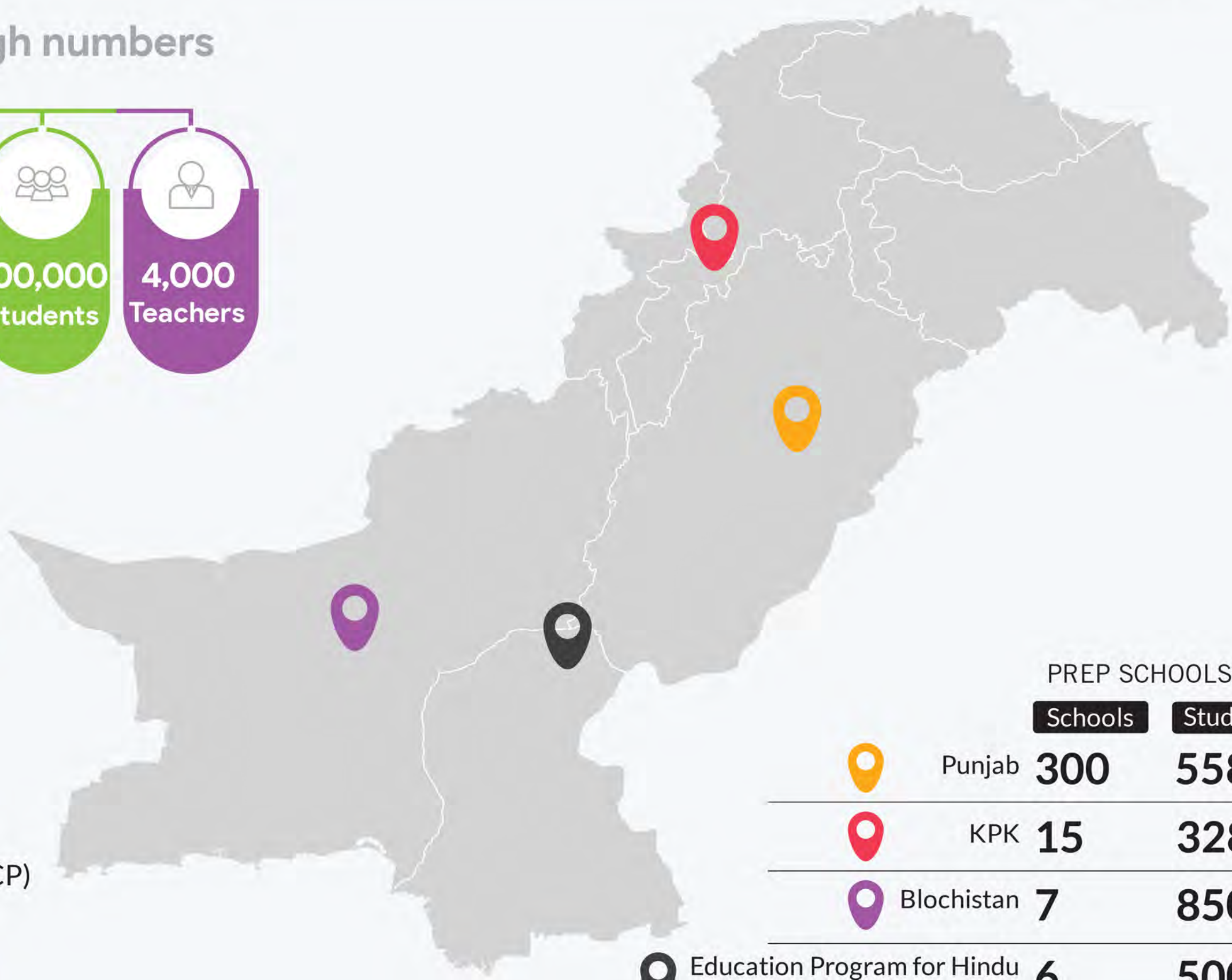
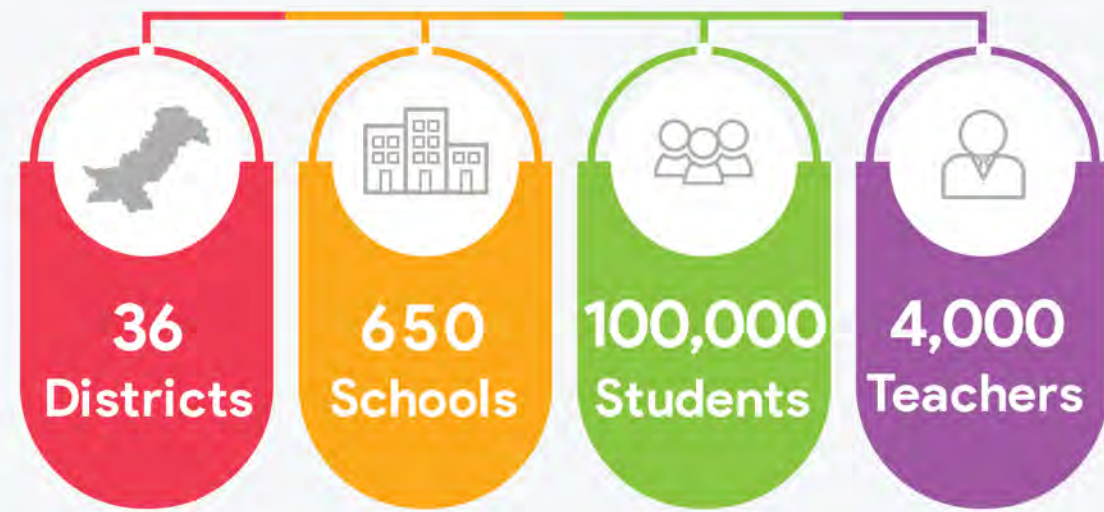

PUBLIC SCHOOL SUPPORT PROGRAM

Fozia Bibi the daughter of Nabi Khan is studying in class 4th in the Governmental Girls Primary School Chak # 7 Rakh Dala, District Bhakhar for the last four years. Her father works as a laborer in the construction of buildings. When she was asked about her feelings about the change in administration of the school under the Public School Support Program, she said “when we came to know that our teachers were being transferred to other schools we were disappointed because we had a very cordial relation with them. It caused worry amongst us that we might not be able to adjust with new teachers. We were surprised when the newly appointed female teachers and principal developed conducive environment in a very short span of time. Peoples of our village, who did not send their children to school because of lack of quality of education, trusted the new administration of GET and admitted their children to school. Suddenly, the number of students began to increase in the school. I think, after one year, that the adoption of our school by GET is truly a blessing of Allah. We, the children of entire village, are very grateful to the administration of GET for providing us a quality education in a very congenial atmosphere

The downtrodden education system in Punjab is an issue for the entire province. Therefore, the Punjab Education Foundation (PEF) devised a policy to devolve the management of low-performing primary schools into the worthy hands of the private sector while incurring financial expenses. In this regard, Punjab Education Foundation entrusted the managerial skills of Ghazali Education Trust and tendered 82 schools in the districts of Bhakhar and Mianwali. The primary problems of these schools were high dropouts and low enrollments coupled with a lack of quality education. These factors further exacerbated the problem as the parents stopped sending their children to school. Therefore, soon after the possession, GET launched an awareness campaign in both districts in order to educate the people about the wonders of education. Trust founded local school committees and Mother's Forum to further raise awareness in the community regarding education. The campaign was so successful that the net enrollment rate increased many folds. The average enrollment per school jumped from 42 students to 112 students. Moreover, the trust renovated all these schools and fulfilled their basic necessities i.e. 55 classrooms and 20 washrooms have been built by the trust. Besides, it conducted teacher training workshops on cluster bases to enhance the teachers' efficiency. Due to the managerial and administrative skills of GET, the dropout rate has been decreased to 5% and the net enrollment rate is increasing day by day.

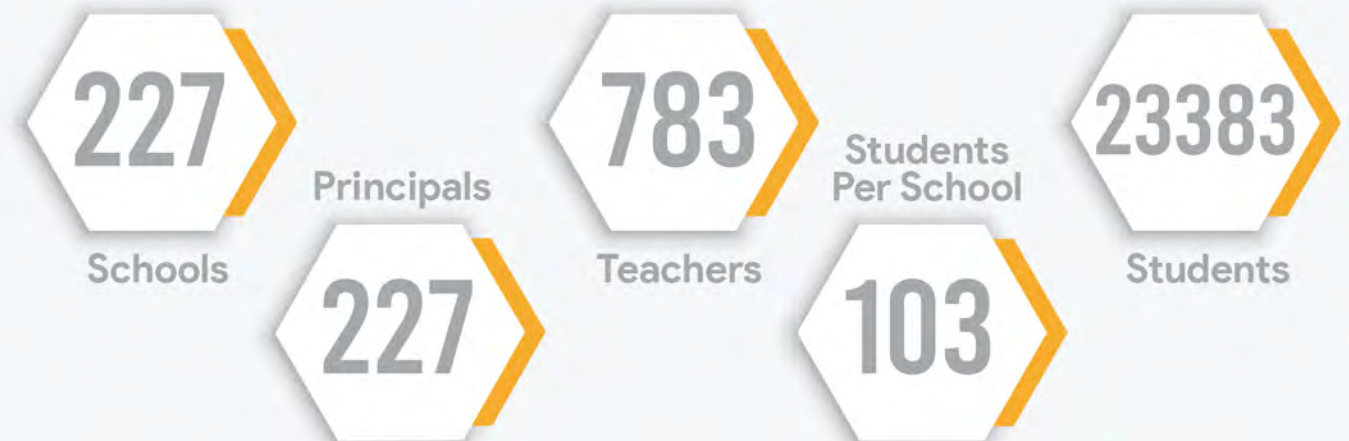


OUT OF SCHOOL CHILDREN ENROLMENT PROGRAM

Bilqis Bibi, Basti Chandia, Tehsil Muzaffargarh. Eleven years old Bilqis of Basti Chandia Tehsil Muzaffargarh whose father died when she was three years old while her mother got remarried and left the children inattentive because her stepfather could not take the responsibility of looking after a crowded family. Now Bilqis lives with her married stepsister, Haliah.

Bilqis is a student of Nursery in Ghazali Education Trust School Basti Chandia. Eleven years old Bilqis does not feel embarrassed studying in Nursery because 17 more children of the same age group are her class fellows. Had her sisters been literate, she would have taken admission at an early age. Six months back when Ghazali Education Trust established school over there, many of the parents showed a willingness to send their daughters to the school. During these three months, Bilqis has learned numbers, alphabets, how to make sentences and has also recited 18 Paras of the Holy Quran. Bilqis believes that whatever she has learned can now transfer to newcomers effectively. She idealizes her teachers. Her innocent gestures are when asked, "I shall become a teacher after completing my Matriculation".

Under the auspices of Punjab Education Foundation (PEF) co-sponsored by DFID, GET was entrusted with the arduous task of alleviating the pitiful condition of education in Muzaffargarh whose literacy rate of 29% stood at the lowest ebb, as mentioned in Nelson Report of 2013. Thus, GET initiated an out-of-school children enrollment program that aims to bring those children to school who had never attended school before. Afterward, GET formulated a plan to open a school in an area where there had been no school within a radius of 1km. Hitherto, GET has opened 239 schools in this district in which 23,744 children are getting primary education. GET is also providing learning support material to students in terms of free books, school bags, and shoes. Moreover, GET has contrived "Teachers' Forum" in order to create awareness in society regarding the benefits of education and to implore the parents to send their children to school. GET regularly conducts teacher training workshops on cluster bases to ensure the quality of education in schools. The success factor can be gauged by the renewed entrust on part of an ever-increasing number of children looking forward to going to school. Now the trust is setting its sight on opening new schools to educate a great many children.



NEW SCHOOL PROGRAM

In Bhakkar & Jhang Ghazali Education Trust established 32 schools funded by the Government of Punjab in areas where there is an access gap as government or private schools are unavailable or very few in numbers. GET mobilized 5000 families on the importance of their children's education. Moreover, in these 32 schools, all basic Facilities are present and 3186 students are getting free of cost education.

PAKISTAN RURAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

Sana Nazir is a student presently studying in GET School, 30 G.B Faisalabad. Her story is among one of the success stories of Ghazali Education Trust.

“My name is Sana Nazir and my father name is Muhammad Nazir. I have four sisters and a brother. I am studying in class 6th of Ghazali Education Trust School 30 G.B, Faisalabad. My father died in my early childhood and at that time there was no bread earner in my family. In these difficult circumstances, GET showed us a ray of hope. My four sisters and brother named Yasmin Nazir, Zainab Nazair, Fozia Nazir, Muhammad Azeem Nazir and Misbah Nazir got education from school established by GET under its rural education program. My two elder sisters taught in PREP schools after the completion of their intermediate education. The trust helped them in the continuation of their studies, and by virtue of which, they were able to peruse their Master's in Education (M.Ed.). Moreover, GET helped us in the marriages of my elder sisters and incurred most of the expenses. The trust also helped my brother in setting a shop. Finally, I want to thank GET because if GET had not been there for us, we would surely not have been able to lead a dignified life.”

The Basic purpose of GET was the upliftment of the economic backwaters areas of Pakistan by establishing educational institutes for providing quality education based on the values of quality, equality, and transparency. The statistics from the economic survey revealed that 21% of primary schools in the country are being run by a single teacher while 14% have one room. Of all the children enrolled in a primary school in Pakistan, 69% are retained until class 5 and only 28% until class 10, by the higher-secondary level almost 85% are not in school. GET's "Pakistan Rural Education Program" (PREP) is endeavoring to open new schools in rural areas of Pakistan where the process of education is degenerating due to the absence of appreciable schools. PREP impulses to provide an education that has a valuable synthesis of modern knowledge with Islamic values and beliefs in order to enable the new generation to face the challenges of modern society. This program is focusing on establishing new schools in all provinces like schools for minorities, colleges for women, and resource rooms for special children. Additionally, PREP is also providing its assistant to public schools to increase their efficiency. Currently, 650 schools are providing quality based education to more than 100,000 students.

LITERATE BALOCHISTAN PROGRAM

Village Mekhtar is considered as the most remote village of Loralai, deprived of basic needs to live, located at the distance of 65 km. from the main city. it was very difficult for the children of this village to go to school every day. Thus, GET established a school in this village on the wishes of its residents. Now the children of this village are very happy upon the new school. One of the students of Ghazali Education Trust School Mekhtar shared his story with us.

“My name is Azeem Shah and I am studying in the 8th class. My village is considered as one of the most underdeveloped village of the district where we lack in our basic needs and quality education. Most of the students are poor and cannot afford the burden of study but GET has provided us an opportunity to get a quality education at our doorsteps. Before this school, I had to cover a distance of three km to reach the school which caused so much distress in me. Now, it is very comfortable for me to get education because of GET school. I am very grateful to this trust because it not only educates me but also helps me to develop my character. One day I shall become an Army Officer and shall serve my nation.”

The educational deprivation of Balochistan is a great concern for the whole nation. If there is a province that needs the collective attention of the entire country, is Balochistan. Therefore, Ghazali Education Trust felt the need to elevate the standard of education in Balochistan in order to educate the children and to align them in the mainstream of Pakistan. In 2011, GET established three schools in districts of Ziarat and Lorelei and their number has been increased to seven this year. GET aims to provide quality education without the discrimination of gender, cast, creed, or religion. To ensure the net enrollment rate, GET launched the awareness campaign with the help of native individuals to urge the community to send their children to school. The campaign paid itself, and currently, hundreds of students are getting value-based quality education in the most remote areas of Balochistan at their doorsteps. GET makes sure the enrollment of girls and persuades the community to send their daughters as well. Consequently, the boys and girls ratio is 54% and 46% respectively in GET schools. However, Balochistan needs the collective effort of the whole nation. We, therefore, appeal to every individual to play his constructive role in the educational development of Balochistan.

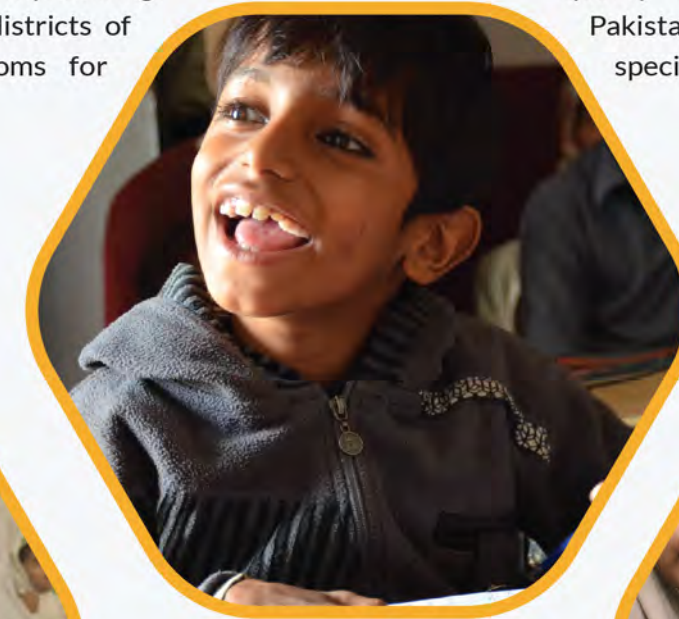


RURAL INCLUSIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM

Hamza Akther

Thousands of special children live in villages and have no basic facility that provides learning. Hamza Akther was one among them. He has congenitally Down syndrome. So he has less attention span, short memory and other cognitive issues which has impeded his mental growth. The parents of Hamza were worried about him as he couldn't take care of himself and often left their work to look after him. When he tried to play with other children of the town, they beat him and he was not able to defend himself. They were at ease when they heard that Ghazali Education Trust is providing free education to the special children. They got him admitted in GET school Herdev, Shiekhupura, which is exclusively designed for the special children. Before GET, he was not able to return to home once he stepped outside, but after attending the classes, he is able to do daily usage work like going to washroom, eating on time, helping the parents and remembering the paths to his home. Now his parents are very happy about him and hope to see better results in the future.

There are only 744 schools both government and private in all over Pakistan for the disabled person and the government is approximately spending Rs. 45 per disabled person, according to the newspaper "Dawn's" report. Taking it as a national responsibility, Ghazali Education Trust has initiated a Rural Inclusive Education Program for children with special needs in its schools. The primary objective of RIEP is to provide education to special children according to their needs and to equip them with skills necessary to lead a normal life. RIEP believes that a disabled person can live a normal life and compete with other normal children after proper education and training. Moreover, RIEP has made sure the regular visits of psychologists, special educationalists, and trainers in order to improve teaching strategies and methodologies due to the unique needs of special children. The team of RIEP regularly establishes the assessment camps in different cities to examine the extent of disability in children and suggests possible treatments. Up till now, RIEP has brought hundreds of special children back to normal life. Now, 27 resource rooms are providing quality education to 1000 special students in six different districts of Pakistan, and GET is committed to open more resource rooms for special children in its schools.

ORPHAN AND NEEDY PROGRAM

The story of Noor Fatima is the story of every orphan who lost every hope to study after the death of her parents. Ghazali Education Trust provides hope to these desolate children and encourages them to pursue their goals.

“My name is Noor Fatima. I am studying in class Two in Ghazali Education Trust School Maliyan Sheikhpura. The only thing I remember about my father is that he often said to me that my daughter will be a doctor someday, but after the death of him, I lost every hope. Thereafter, Ghazal Education Trust took the responsibility for my education. Trust provides me free education, books, school bag, shoes and stationery. Most importantly, GET gives me a hope to fulfill my father dreams. Insha'Allah I will study hard and will become a doctor one day.”

She is very friendly and has a good relationship with other girls. Teachers of Noor Fatima are also very optimistic about her. In the words of her teacher “Noor Fatima is a very brilliant and hardworking student. I am sure that she will become a Doctor in future”.

The common assumption about an orphan is a child who has lost his parents but Ghazali Education Trust adopts a more inclusive definition which tends to focus on a child who is deprived of parental care. Thereby, GET initiated an Orphan/Needy support program (ONSP) at the moment of its inception to accommodate those children who do not have parents or their parents don't take care of them in order to provide them an opportunity to get a quality education. Therefore, GET designed a comprehensive educational program for the orphan/ needy students in more than 35 districts of rural Pakistan. Now, GET is assisting 47,000 students to get a free quality education in order to improve their socio-economic and moral conditions. Besides this, GET is also providing free books, uniforms, school bags, and shoes to the registered orphan/needy students with the help of donors and other organizations. Moreover, Trust embraces them and regularly held events to comfort them and gives them gifts on special occasions like Eid or Orphan day. However, Ghazali Education Trust is sponsoring thousands of orphan/needy students in rural Pakistan but millions of students are waiting for your assistance to get a free education.

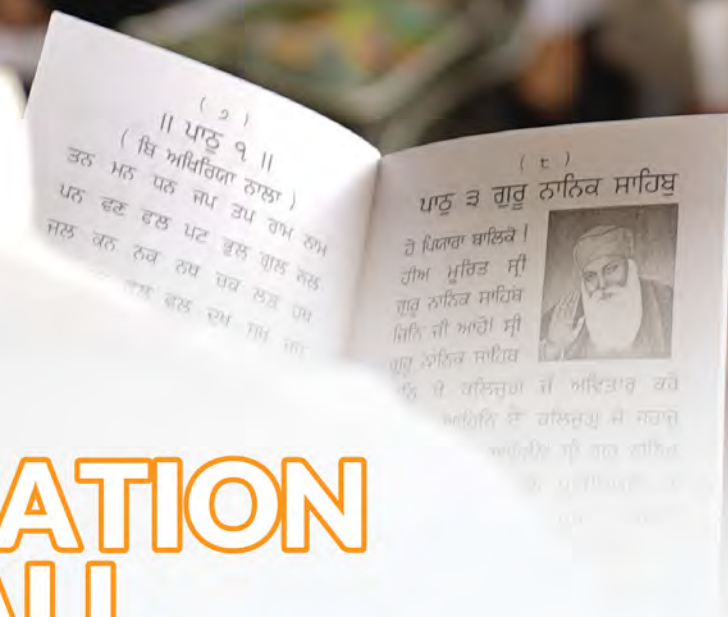

There is a scarcity of health, education, and economic opportunities for the minorities, especially for the Hindus in Pakistan. There is a dire need to allocate resources for their education so that they could play their part in the solidarity and progress of the country. Ghazali Education Trust is determined to educate the children of the Hindu community preferably in the rural areas of South Punjab and Sindh. GET has addressed the issues arising in the community and tried to solve the problems of education.

Trust has also printed brochures exclusively for Hindu community to arise awareness and persuasion for the parents to get their children admitted in these schools. Moreover, it has established 6 schools for the minorities in the districts of Bahawalpur, Kashmor and Rahim Yar Khan. In these schools, Hindu students are getting formal education according to their own beliefs and in their own language. Additionally, GET initiated a skill development program for teachers of these schools to enhance their capabilities. Now 500 students are studying in these schools

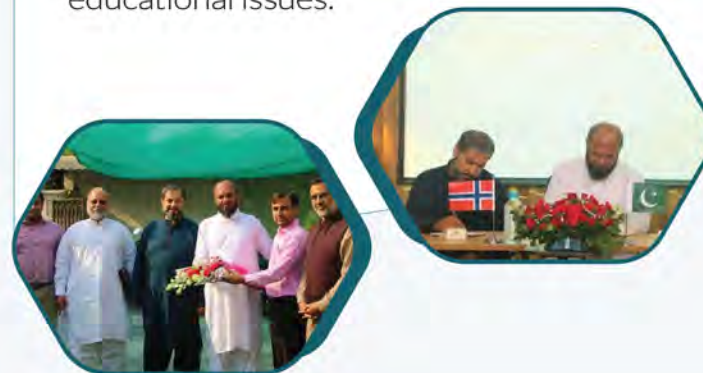
